Skills Gap and Industry Analysis for Apparel Sector in Haryana

Brief Profile of Haryana

Haryana is among the northern most states in India and adjacent to national capital Delhi. It is surrounded by Uttar Pradesh in the east, Punjab in the west, Himachal Pradesh in the north and Rajasthan in the south. The state surrounds the national capital city, New Delhi, from three sides. Historically an agrarian state, Haryana today is a well-developed industrial state.

Migration Trend in the State

As per the NSDC's Skill Gap Survey Report, Haryana has a significantly higher migration in urban areas in comparison to rural areas, which is similar to the trend observed at a national level. Within urban areas, Gurgaon, Manesar and Faridabad have emerged as industrial agglomerate over the years and have been a historical destination for in-ward migration both within state and from other states.

The male migration rate is far lower than female migration rate, in both rural and urban areas. Seeking better livelihood and employment opportunities has been the key driver for migration

amongst male population in Haryana. While for female population in the state, marriage has been the key driver for migration.

Migration offers better economic prospects for individuals in the state as there is significant increase in number of people engaged in economic activities post migration. Non-work related aspects form the prominent reason for migration. A significant increase in self-employment has been observed due to migration, especially in rural parts of Haryana, while casual labour composition shows marginal increase in comparison to other activities, in rural Haryana and a decrease in urban Haryana. There is a marked increase in the salaried class post migration in urban Haryana.

Youth Aspiration in State

Entry level salaries in industries and awareness of career opportunities in the district are other pivotal factors influencing youth preference. Students from weaker sections of the society, both economically and socially, are seen to opt for vocational courses over higher education programs primarily due to financial constraints. Awareness of career opportunities was limited or medium across most districts. Low levels of awareness of career opportunities.

The Sectoral Preference for employment is as followed:

1. High: Auto and Auto Components, Electrical and Electronics, Manufacturing of Engineering Goods, IT- ITES
2. Medium: Textile and Apparel, Chemical and Processing, Drug and Pharmaceuticals, Construction, Retail, Transportation and Logistics, Tourism and Hospitality, Banking and Finance, Healthcare, Education and Training

Proposed Sector/Trade

Based on our secondary and primary research, we have selected Sewing Machine operator course in Apparel Sector to impart training. The selection is made based on the training requirements on the state, current availability of the courses in the state and youth aspirations.

Apparel Sector in Haryana

Faridabad is one of the biggest industrial city of Haryana as well as North India. Rohtak has the largest wholesale cloth market of Asia, known as shori market. Existence of large scale industries of Textile and Apparel projects high human resource requirement in the state. Also, textile and apparel is found to be potential sector of growth in districts like Gurgaon, Hisar and Panipat.

Skill Gaps in Selected Sectors

Apparel Sector –

- Inadequate understanding of the current fashion trends in the market especially at the designer levels
- On-the-job training is provided as youth coming out of institutes are reported to be short on practical exposure due to lack of latest machinery and equipment available in the educational / training institutes
- Inadequate understanding of operations
- Inadequate understanding of safety and quality standards
- Lack of co-ordination with the buyer leading to wastages

Conclusion

As per NSDC skill gap report and our primary as well as secondary research, it can be concluded that apparel sector are among one of the demanding sector in the state of Haryana. Places like Gurgaon, Okhla, Faridabad have huge placement opportunities. Nearby areas like Noida also have good placement opportunities. We are proposing to place our candidates within the state as well as outside the state.

Proposed Salary: We propose to place the trained candidates at a salary as mentioned in the minimum state wages law which ranges from INR 7,500- 10,000 per month depending upon the grade of the workers.

Along with 310 hours of rigorous training as per AMHSSC (apparel made House sector skill council) , we also provided them with a digital training which is in line with the digital India programme.

We mobilized these candidates from areas like palla, Tilpat, Shiv colony, vedram colony, Sarai Khawaja, 13 / 3 Santosh Nagar, shramik vihar etc. Major population in these areas is Economically backward, migrated population from different parts of the country.

With all our efforts we enormously worked towards women empowerment. We want to trained approx 200 candidates in the financial year 2021-22. More than 70% of our candidates what placed in well known export houses in Faridabad and approximately 30% started their own tailoring centres at their preferred locations.

This has helped them to upgrade their standard of living and get a stable source of income for themselves and their families.
